Morgans at The Super Convention!

Plans for The Super Convention are firming up and while it is a convention of four equine associations, the Morgan family will be celebrated in style!

The 2016 Super Convention will take place February 9-13 in Boston, Massachusetts, at the Westin Boston Waterfront Hotel. This is a first-time joint convention between AMHA, the American Saddlebred Horse Association (ASHA), the American Hackney Horse Society (AHHS), and the United Professional Horsemen's Association (UPHA). A great line up of guest speakers will complement several industry professionals, which will be on hand to discuss the past, present, and future of the American Saddlebred, Hackney, and Morgan horse. Recipients of AMHA awards will be honored and celebrated in four different venues: the Thursday Annual Meeting of Members, Thursday's AMHA Luncheon, Friday evening awards ceremony, and Saturday's evening awards gala.

Among the awards distributed at the annual meeting of members include all AMHA club awards and the AMHA outgoing director awards. The awards presented at the Thursday luncheon include the Therapy Horse of the Year, Dr. Albert Lucine Promoter Award, Golden Reins, Show Horse Hall of Fame induction, Mabel Owen Media Award, and the AMHA Open Competition recipients. Also honored will be USEF Morgan judges.

Among the awards distributed at the Friday evening awards ceremony include the Cecil Brown Sportsmanship Award, the Young Person Award, and the Professional Horseman Award. Saturday evening will see in the Person of the Year honored as well as inductions into AMHA's Breeders' Hall of Fame and Hall of Fame.

AMHA Announces 2015 Awardees

The AMHA Awards Committee is pleased to announce the following individuals will be recognized at The Super Convention, which will take place February 9-13 in Boston. Congratulations to all!

The Breeders' Hall of Fame honors breeders who have produced Morgans that have had a significant impact on the breed. This year's honorees are **Graycliff** of Wisconsin, **Indian Creek** of Indiana, and **Lynn Peeples** of New Jersey.

Inducted into AMHA's Hall of Fame are **Suzy Lucine** of Pennsylvania and **Sherry Cole** of Indiana.

The Person of the Year Award honors the individual who has made particularly exceptional contributions to the support and preservation of the Morgan breed and/or AMHA. This year's honoree is **Larry Bolen** of Illinois.

Inducted into the Show Horse Hall of Fame this year are **Legacys Viking** and **Noble Flaire**. **Shanna Gish** of Indiana has been selected by her peers as the recipient of the Professional Award.

The Golden Reins Award is given to a Morgan professional who has had a 30-year career in training or instruction. **Jeff Morse** of Massachusetts is this year's recipient.

Jerome Parker of Massachusetts will be awarded the Cecil Brown Memorial Sportsmanship Award, which recognizes an individual who exemplifies sportsmanship in and out of the ring during horse show competition.

Ellen Di Bella of Colorado will be honored with the first Dr. Albert Lucine Promoter Award for her many years of going above and beyond in breed promotion.

Steven Handy of Massachusetts will be honored for his breed promotion and industry outreach with the Young Person Award.

One Morgan will receive special recognition for his work with people with disabilities. This year's honoree is **Cairnbrae Shenanigan**, a therapy horse at One Heart Equestrian Therapy in Iowa and owned by Cairnbrae Farm in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Brenda Tippin of Oregon will be honored for her body of work by receiving the Mabel Owen Media Award.

Educational Forums at The Super Convention

To take advantage of all four associations coming together for this year's Super Convention (AHHS, AMHA, ASHA, UPHA) to be held February 9-13 at the Westin Boston Waterfront Hotel, Boston, MA, a new format will be used for the traditional educational forums. Instead of breaking out into separate groups for different topics, there will be one two-day "conversation" regarding the Past, Present and Future of the American Saddlebred, Hackney Pony, and Morgan Horse.

Beginning at 9 a.m. on Friday, February 12, the respective associations will give a brief history of their breeds. From there the conversation will go into the "Present" with the noted equine promoter Patti Colbert leading the discussion. The American Horse Publications Association named Colbert the 2014 Equine Innovator of the Year. That afternoon the conversation of the "Present" continues with several industry related topics and professionals (vets, blacksmiths, trainers, breeders, media experts) leading the discussion and answering questions from the attendees.

On Saturday, February 13, the conversation will focus on the "Future" and that will begin with Jay Hickey from the American Horse Council updating us on legislation. Again, that conversation will take place in the morning and continue that afternoon.

All in all there will be six hours of conversation on topics such as:

- How technology has changed the industry, both for the good and bad.
- Trends: among other things, discussions on clothing, saddles, and "the look" for equitation. Also, there is a discussion on the importance of keeping up with the changing times without losing the tradition of our breeds.
- Marketability the need to find more avenues for our show horse breeds to be useful. There is a look at opening up a better network within the breeds, but especially within disciplines to help find every horse an appropriate job, whether that is a show horse, a sport horse or a backyard trail horse.
- Lesson Programs the future of the industry! How do we get more people to want to teach and not just want to be trainers?
- Breeding Programs discussion on the trend of dropping registrations numbers with all the breeds and how to turn that trend around.
- Open Horse Shows discussion on the importance of cohesiveness between the show horse breeds. How do we combine efforts so we all work together to grow the sport of showing horses.
- Self Promotion discussion on how to promote to the general public and other horse avenues (racing, hunter/jumpers) to sell them on the romance of our disciplines.
- Public Perception continue to find a way to educate others about the difference between us and breeds that are in the spotlight for cruelty as well as how to deal with the animal rights activists.
- Doing A Great Good discussion on how to do a better job of "tooting our own horn" for all of the great work that has been done with programs like Ribbons Of Service for St. Jude's Hospital and the Pink Ribbon Program, which raised so much money for breast cancer research.
- Taking Care of Athletes discussion on proper training and maintenance (vet work, shoeing, etc.) for both the horse and riders (workout programs).

These will be some of the highlight topics that will be discussed among the attendees and professionals. The idea to bring this all together as one continuous conversation came from several committee meetings and the idea that we should all be sharing in this knowledge in order to ensure the healthy future of our respective breeds and disciplines.

"This is everyone's chance to be heard and to share knowledge among our various breeds and interests," said Forums Chairman Gary Garone. "Instead of just lecturing on these subjects this will be a 'structured conversation' with various professionals there to give feedback and answer questions on the topics. The fact that it will be held over a two-day period in four different sessions will allow for attendees to discuss these topics in between sessions and come back with ideas. We invite everyone to be in Boston and be a part of the solution!"

The grant application period opens Friday, January 1, 2016 and closes at 5 p.m. on Thursday, March 31, 2016.

On a night dedicated to the horse, one special Morgan athlete was recognized for her excellence in 2015 during the USEF's Year-End Awards Gala. In a year that witnessed equestrian athletes excel, PVF Peace of Mind reached the pinnacle of her sport and for her achievement was named International Horse of the Year. Voting was open to the public through January and this horse, already a fan favorite, was rewarded for her tremendous results throughout 2015 with support from voters.

PVF Peace Of Mind, the charismatic eight-year-old Morgan mare, reached unbelievable heights in 2015 and has proven to be unbeatable with owner Suzy Stafford. In the carriage, in an astonishing feat of competitive excellence, "Hunny" won in each of her three FEI combined driving events this year, including the CAI2* Hermitage Classic in Goshen, Kentucky, the prestigious CAI2* Kentucky Classic in Lexington, Kentucky, and a second consecutive win at the CAI2* Live Oak

International in Ocala, Florida. Most importantly, Hunny's dominating performance in all three phases of competition at Hermitage earned her and Stafford the 2015 USEF Single Horse Driving National Championship by an incredible 14-point margin over their closest rival. Hunny has been undefeated in the dressage arena this year with Stafford. Demonstrating her versatility under saddle, Hunny was undefeated at First Level ridden dressage and crowned First Level Show Champion at the popular Massachusetts Morgan Horse Show this summer.

Morgans Earn NATRC Year-End Awards

The Morgan breed earned several top honors at the recently announced year-end awards for the North American Trail Ride Conference (NATRC).

Windstorm Sienna and Wayne Tolbert are the 2015 Horse Hall of Fame inductee. This team has racked up many NATRC championships through the years and has been a great breed representative.

Silver Valley Tate has earned the Grand Champion High-Average Horse honors with 98.653%. Tate was also the Competitive Pleasure National Champion for Region 6 and placed fifth in the Overall Competitive Pleasure Horse Championship.

NKR April's Jewel is being honored for the 2,000 High-Mileage Award, and Terradocs Oconee Belle for 1,000. And Morgan rider Sallie Kudra is honored as a 6,000-mile rider.
